

Then visit the mighty Soo Locks—one of the world's largest and busiest locks—enabling ships to travel between Lake Superior and the lower Great Lakes.

AUGUST 24: LITTLE CURRENT, MANITOULIN ISLAND (GEORGIAN BAY)

Delight in a scenic early-morning cruise of Georgian Bay, whose verdant pine-fringed coasts, towering rugged cliffs, and diamond-blue waters have inspired some of Canada's most celebrated painters. Travel by motor coach to Manitoulin Island, the world's largest freshwater island. 
